CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS and CARERS

SUMMIT SCHOOL OF JUDO expects that parents/carers will

- Encourage your child to learn the rules and play within them.
- Discourage unfair play and arguing with officials.
- Help your child to recognise good performance, not just results.
- Never force your child to take part in sport.
- Set a good example by recognising fair play & applauding good performances of all.
- Never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Publicly accept officials' judgements.
- o Support your child's involvement and help them to enjoy their sport.
- Use correct and proper language at all times.
- Encourage and guide performers to accept responsibility for their own performance and behaviour.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR MEMBERS (INCLUDING REFEREES, OFFICIALS AND ALL OTHER VOLUNTEERS)

Members of **SUMMIT SCHOOL OF JUDO** are expected to abide by the following code of conduct:

- o All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background or religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach. Members should NOT wear suits outside of the Dojo unless covered by a tracksuit.
- No Footwear to be worn on the mat, Footwear is to be worn at all times off the mat.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly
- Members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Members are not allowed to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs (apart from medicinal drugs) whilst practising and other SUMMIT SCHOOL OF JUDO Activites (coaching, training etc).
